Other peer-impressing features include good connection options and low fan noise. There's no lens shift though, so your thoughts about set-up will have to extend beyond "I'll shove it on the coffee table".

At £3,000 this costs about the same as a second hand Fiat Punto, and does considerably fewer miles to the gallon. It also isn't quite as user-friendly as some of the models we've seen recently, but for the true cinema buff, this is a superb choice. It's not even like three grand is that expensive these days.
